

## Updates on Programmes for November – December 2013

### A. Radio

No.	Date	Items
1.	October - December	Fifteen auditioning outreaches to various districts had been organised for the RTHK Apprenticeship Scheme (香港電台學徒計劃等緊你) which began in mid-October. The purpose is to discover potential broadcasting talents from the population at large, and to train them to become broadcasters. Selection interviews will be held in December.
2.	1 November	Radio 3 organised “The Hong Kong International Literary Festival”, featuring interviews with dozens of authors and moderate panels.
3.	5 November	Radio 5 held the “Elderly MTR Safety Campaign” (長者港鐵安全運動) to promote public transport safety.
4.	10 November	Radio 1’s Family Affairs organised a “Parenting Seminar” (訴心事家庭 — 青年成長路家長講座) to encourage family harmony.
5.	11 November	Radio 3 officially launched its annual Operation Santa Claus. A Charity Beach Competition would be held in December to raise funds in a fun way. An MBA Charity Challenge would also be held in December where students from five universities would compete to draw up a business plan to raise money for the Operation and its beneficiaries.
6.	15 November	Radio 3 launched the Top Story Competition 2013, with “Celebration” as the theme.
7.	16 November	Public Affairs Unit convened the “Voices from the Hall” (眾言堂) to address issues of public concern, and invited the Chief Executive, Mr C Y Leung to the forum.
8.	23 November	Radio 2 organised “The 5 <sup>th</sup> Youth Arts Festival” (第五屆青藝節 – 青少年藝術家年賞) to encourage the development of arts among the youth.
9.	24 November	Putonghua Channel conducted the “Inter-Varsity Putonghua Debate Competition Final” (大專普通話辯論決賽) and invited the President of the Legislative Council, Mr Jasper Tsang as guest.
10.	29 November – 1 December	Radio 3 will produce and broadcast live “Clockenflap” as part of Hong Kong’s biggest Music and Arts Festival at the West Kowloon Waterfront.

11.	30 November	Radio 2 will participate in the “Safe Journey” Drama Festival (安全之旅舞台劇公演), a theatrical production to promote the message of safe sex among the community.
12.	1 December	Radio 2 will initiate the “Young Politicians Graduation Ceremony” (政壇新秀訓練班升級典禮) to foster political awareness among the youth.
13.	16, 20 & 23 December	Radio 1, Radio 5 and Digital Audio Broadcasting will take part in the Products and Brands Expo Week to promote the programmes and personalities of the channels.
14.	20 December	Application for the third-batch Community Involvement Broadcasting Service (CIBS) programmes for the 5 <sup>th</sup> and 6 <sup>th</sup> quarters will commence. Promotional activities will be organised to attract public attention.
15.	24 December	Radio 4 will produce the “Christmas Concert in the Park” (聖誕園林音樂會) at Tamar to share some festive music in the open.
16.	25 December	Cultural and Education Unit will relay the annual Christmas Midnight Mass (聖誕子夜彌撒) at the Hong Kong Cathedral of Immaculate Conception.
17.	27 December	Radio 2 will produce the “Fight Drugs Musical” (「同行抗毒」音樂劇) as the finale of the Solar Project 2013.
18.	30 December	Radio 2 will announce the 2013 Man of the Year Selection in the Morning Suite programme (「晨光第一線 2013 風雲人物大選」結果公布).

## **B. TV Programmes**

<b>No.</b>	<b>Date</b>	<b>Items</b>
1.	November	Rehabilitation Mini-programme – “Employment” (有能者。聘之) is a 5-minute programme which briefly introduces the employment of mentally and physically handicapped in Hong Kong
2.	November	“Cultural Heritage - The Never ending Trail” (文化長河- 萬里行) is a documentary programme series co-produced with the Committee on the Promotion of Civic Education. The programme looks back at the history of human civilizations which have flourished along the rivers and mountainous landscapes in China.

3.	November	A new TV series “Nature and Man In One” (天人合一) will explore hot environmental issues such as global warming, decline in species, contamination of water sources, loss of soil, degradation of air quality, etc. Chinese philosophical theories such as Yin Yang and The Five Elements will also be employed to shed light on the root of the environmental problems and their solutions.
4.	December	“Kung Fu Quest - Vision Beyond Borders” will feature Hong Kong Kung Fu practitioners searching for the physical performance and inner energy from different forms of martial arts created and evolved in the countries situated near the borders of China.
5.	December	A new series of “Hong Kong Stories” (香港故事 - 百年樹人) will introduce the tradition, ethos and culture of ten schools. Two generations of students will be interviewed to see how they have been inspired by the spirits of their schools in pursuit of their dreams and brilliant achievements in their careers.
6.	December	In recent decades, graffiti has evolved from notorious vandalism to a recognised street style or even a popular artistic genre. “Life on the Wall” (活在牆上) follows graffiti artists around the globe to explore this evolution and how it alters graffiti culture. The series is consisted of five episodes and will feature cities with notable role in graffiti culture, such as New York, Berlin, London and Bristol.
7.	December	“Year Enders” is in retrospect on major news event in the year.
