

**Updates on Programmes for
September – October 2015**

Radio

No.	Date	Items
1.	1 September to late October	R3 launched the Talent Search project on 1 September to invite the public to join in programme production. The project will run until late October.
2.	5 September	PAU organized the Hong Kong Humanity Award 2015 (人道年獎 2015), co-organized by Red Cross, which aimed at giving tribute to those who shared the spirit of humanity among the community.
3.	6 September	R2 staged a concert for the Solar Project 2015 Youth Employment Dream Flight at Queen Elizabeth Stadium (太陽計劃 2015：展翅青見夢飛行) to encourage teenagers in pursuit of their dreams.
4.	13 September	R1 will launch the OSH Safety Quiz (職安問答比賽) to promote the public's awareness of occupational safety.
5.	20 September	PTC will host the Inter-Collegiate Putonghua Debate Competition (2015 粵港澳高校普通話辯論賽) with Radio Guangdong and Radio Macau.
6.	24 September	R1 will conduct the Music Lover 10 th Anniversary Concert (音樂情人-沿途有你) to celebrate HK's Top DJ, Tim Cheng's (鄭子誠) for hosting the programme for 10 consecutive years.
7.	25 September to 22 November	R5 will organize the Senior DJ Contest (銀齡 DJ 大賽) to encourage the participation of the elderly in broadcasting. A workshop will be held for participants while a training session will be offered to the finalists selected from an interview. The finale will be held on 22 November.
8.	26 - 27 September	Community Involvement Broadcasting Scheme (CIBS) will interview the applicants for Q11 and Q12 programmes.
9.	26 September	R2 will launch the opening ceremony of the micro-movie for Anti-drug Campaign 2015 to deliver the anti-drug message to the youth.
10.	17 October	CIBS will conduct a facilitation talk for applicants of Q11 and Q12 programmes.
11.	25 October	R5 will organize the Radio College for the Elderly - High Table Dinner (長者學苑高桌晚宴) to teach the elderly western table manners and to enhance their social communication skills.

B. TV Programmes

No.	Date	Items
1.	September	Relay the Ceremony to Commemorate the 70th Anniversary of Chinese People's War of Resistance 轉播中國人民抗日戰爭勝利 70 周年紀念儀式
2.	September	CS Outstanding Award 2015 (傑出部門群英會 2015) (1 x one hour) Through award presentation, brilliant work and achievement of the Civil Services teams will be introduced to the public.
3.	September	Movies of Our Times IV (光影我城 IV) (35 episodes x one hour) Repackage of the classic drama series, including 「香港夢」、「屋簷下」、「人間有情」及「論盡都市人」
4.	September	Solar Project Concert 2015 (太陽計劃音樂會 2015) (2 episodes x half hour)
5.	September	Hong Kong Stories - Their love stories (香港故事 - 他們的情書) (10 episodes x half hour) The programme is filmed as a documentary, from the first-person perspective of the youth. Through interviews with elders and relatives, and searching for photos and letters, youngsters seek to understand the stories of parents or grandparents in their days. During the investigation, the youngsters' personal feelings and perception of love interweave, and at the same time, changes of relationship between the youngsters and their families are recorded. The programme ends with a love letter written by the younger generations for the older generations, with the content supplemented by aesthetic mood and images, in a bid to let the audience feel its sentiment.
6.	September	Transformers (訪談節目 - 香港有你) (8 episodes x half hour) The programme will interview 8 persons in different industries who have brought changes to Hong Kong.
7.	September	Between Two Generations (兩代之間) (10 episodes x half hour) The programme would explore the changes and differences, social development and policies etc. between the two generations in the same industry. Besides using first person narration by the cases, professional speakers would be invited to explore the topic on the programme.
8.	September	A Wall-less World 5 (沒有牆的世界 5) (10 episodes x half hour) This series will be a docu-drama featuring the lives of disabled children and youths together with their family, teachers, caretakers and friends.

9.	September	<p>Cruel Wars 戰火無情 (8 episodes x one hour)</p> <p>In “The Cruel Wars”, a documentary series with eight one hour episodes, audience will revisit the impact of war and terrorist attacks on human by watching Nazi Germany’s demented Adolf Hitler, the rise of Japanese militarism, Vietnamese War, Afghanistan war and the surge in ISIS. Hopefully, through learning from the history of those ruthless wars, we can reflect on how human can achieve the noble dream charged by Hermann Hesse, the Nobel Prize in Literature winner, “the mind ought to serve not war and annihilation, but peace and reconciliation.”</p>
10.	September	<p>Robocon 2015 – Badminton Robo-Game (全港大專生機械人大賽 2015 - 羽毛球爭霸戰) (1 x half hour)</p> <p>“Robocon 2015” is organised by the Hong Kong Institution of Engineers and co-organised by the Hong Kong Computer Society and Radio Television Hong Kong. Altogether 10 elite teams from 6 institutions will participate in this contest, namely the University of Hong Kong, the Hong Kong University of Science and Technology, the Chinese University of Hong Kong, the Hong Kong Institute of Vocational Education, the Hong Kong Polytechnic University and the City University of Hong Kong. The hosting city of this year’s international Robocon is Jakarta, Indonesia.</p>
11.	September	<p>Hugh Laurie: Copper Bottom Blues (1 x one hour)</p> <p>Actor and musician Hugh Laurie makes a pilgrimage across America to explore the country’s blues music, as he performs a series of gigs across the US, starting in New York and ending on the Queen Mary in Long Beach, California, where his musical hero, Professor Longhair, once gave a concert.</p> <p>Along the way, the House star reveals why he has such a passion for the genre, visits the studios of Ray Charles, meets Muddy Waters’ son Mud Morganfield and duets with Jools Holland. Laurie’s long-time friend and collaborator Stephen Fry also makes an appearance.</p>
12.	September	<p>Kraftwerk - Pop Art (1 x one hour)</p> <p>The amazing story of how a group of reclusive Rhineland experimentalists became one of the most influential pop groups of all time. The documentary features three exclusive live tracks filmed, at their Tate Modern shows in London, interwoven with expert analysis, archive footage of the group, newsreel of the era and newly-shot cinematic evocations of their obsessions – motion, cycling, travel, globalism, communication, automation and the harmonious coexistence of man, nature and technology.</p>

13.	September	<p>演藝薈萃：Judy Collins: Live At the Metropolitan Museum of Art (Judy Collins：大都會藝術博物館演唱會) (1 x 90 minutes)</p> <p>The program includes some of her biggest hits, including “Both Sides Now”, “Send in the Clowns”, “Mr. Tambourine Man”, and “The Moon Is a Harsh Mistress”. Other highlights include “Diamonds and Rust”, ”Campo de Encino”, “Pastures of Plenty” with Ani DiFranco, “Since You've Asked” with Shawn Colvin, and “Helplessly Hoping” with Kenny White.</p>
14.	October	The Flag Raising Ceremony and Reception to Celebrate the National Day
15.	October	<p>12 Music Visions (12 音樂門·逃) (13 episodes x one hour), joint production with Radio 2</p> <p>The programme would be a combination of interview, live concert and documentary to introduce the struggling story of 12 outstanding young singers / bands in Hong Kong.</p>
16.	October	<p>Elite Brigade III (火速救兵 III) (5 episodes x one hour)</p> <p>The programme aimed at bringing home the messages of fire prevention, proper use of emergency ambulance services and the advancement in services of the fire and ambulance professions.</p>
17.	October	At Golden Age (加油老友記) (6 episodes x one hour)
18.	October	<p>The Tipping Points 地球逆轉時 (6 episodes x one hour)</p> <p>The Tipping Points is a landmark TV series that explores the emerging tipping points of climate change that have recently drawn concern from scientific communities worldwide for their fragile and near-crisis state.</p> <p>From the Greenland Ice Sheet, the Amazon Rainforest, the High Arctic, the Himalayas, Africa to the Great Southern Ocean, this series goes to the frontline of our changing climate system to find out what’s really happening, and why scientists are so concerned about the rate of change being recorded.</p>
19.	October	<p>The Cure at Hurricane Festival (1 x one hour)</p> <p>The Cure, one of the most popular alternative rock bands in the world, took Hurricane Festival’s stage in 2012, performing their greatest hits including “Love Song” and “Friday I am in Love”.</p>
