今年第二場「樂有所思」,郭嘉瑩會以揚琴展開傳統與現代的對話。

郭嘉瑩是在傳統中國音樂的浸淫中成長,自小已喜愛粵曲,因為家人都唱大戲。不過他們擔心花旦的練功生涯過於艱苦,鼓勵她改學揚琴。所以郭嘉瑩的揚琴根基乃是來自粵劇。她從廣東粵劇學校畢業後,入讀星海音樂學院附中,2005年以優異成績考取全額獎學金入讀香港演藝學院。

在這場「樂有所思」,我們會聽到郭嘉瑩演奏傳統的廣東音樂。廣東音樂有其獨特的暢快韻味,演奏者的即興加花更是精髓所在。郭嘉瑩自小對此熟識,今次更特別將嚴老烈的《倒垂簾》、《連環扣》和《旱天雷》串連成《嚴曲三疊》。

郭嘉瑩既有粵樂的底子,又接受過學院派訓練。我們會在四川流派的《將軍令》和 黃河的獨奏名曲《天山詩畫》中,欣賞到她扎實的演奏技巧。傳統音樂以外,揚琴 都有現代的一面。陸尉俊為揚琴與中樂室樂團所寫的《蘭桂狂想》有從南音發展 而成的旋律,亦融入爵士樂的元素。郭嘉瑩會和李嘉齡合奏揚琴與鋼琴的版本。 日本作曲家近藤裕子為郭嘉瑩而作的《彈性震動》則在調性方面很有挑戰性,堪 稱炫技作品。

期待郭嘉瑩在二號錄音室展示揚琴古今皆宜的面貌。

郭嘉瑩是香港演藝學院首名揚琴專業碩士,現為香港演藝學院揚琴導師、竹韻小集常任樂師及彈撥聲部長,以及香港揚琴學會創辦人兼會長。她在2012年獲得中央電視台「CCTV全國民族器樂電視大賽」傳統器樂組合銀獎。郭氏近年活躍於演奏舞台及致力揚琴教學推廣。

Kwok Ka-ying 郭嘉瑩

In the second instalment of this year's 'Chamber Resonance', the spotlight turns to the incredible talent of yangqin player Kwok Ka-ying, who will guide us through a musical dialogue between traditional melodies and modern sounds.

Kwok comes from a family rooted in the rich tradition of Cantonese opera singing. While her early fascination with Cantonese opera was undeniable, her family encouraged her to focus on yangqin performance instead of going through the extremely demanding training required for dan (female) roles. After graduating from the Guangdong Cantonese Opera School, she continued her musical education at The Music School Attached to Xinghai Conservatory of Music. In 2005, Kwok earned a full scholarship to study at the Hong Kong Academy for Performing Arts, further honing her artistry.

In the upcoming music salon, Kwok will bring the audience into the world of traditional Cantonese music, known for its flowing, lively character and the improvisatory flair that defines this style. The highlight will be a trilogy of Yan Laolie's renowned Cantonese works: Dao-Chui-Lian, United We Go, and Thunder in a Drought, where Kwok's mastery of this genre will undoubtedly shine.

The recital will also showcase Kwok's virtuosity in popular yangqin solo pieces, such as the Sichuan yangqin tune Song of the General and Huang He's evocative A Poetic Picture of Heavenly Mountain. Adding a contemporary twist, Kwok will perform modern works like Luk Wai-chun's Lan Kwai Rhapsody, a unique piece blending melodies inspired by Cantonese nanyin with elements of American jazz. In this performance, Kwok will collaborate with pianist Colleen Lee in a version arranged for yangqin and piano.

Come and experience the captivating fusion of traditional and modern yangqin at 'Chamber Resonance'!

KWOK KA-YING (yangqin)

Kwok Ka-ying is the first postgraduate from the Hong Kong Academy for Performing Arts to be awarded a master's degree in yangqin. She is currently the founder and president of the Hong Kong Yangqin Association, and a resident musician of the Windpipe Chinese Music Ensemble. In 2012, Kwok received Silver Award at the CCTV Chinese Musical Instruments Contest (Chinese Music Ensemble). A passionate advocate for the yangqin, she has dedicated herself to both performing and teaching the instrument in recent years.
