Characters:

Synopsis:

Michelle: Oh Chris... that was the best film I've ever seen. (Sighs) I loved the ending when Arwen and Aragorn got married.
Christine: Me too! It was so romantic.
Michelle: I couldn't stop crying
Christine: Neither could I.
Michelle: And Liv Tyler's dress!
Christine: Beautiful.
Michelle: I'd love to have a dress like that.

Christine: Me t... (remembering she is supposed to be a boy) ... I mean... you'd look lovely in that dress Michelle.
Michelle: D'you think so Chris? How sweet.... Who was your favourite character?
Christine: (Drooling) Legolas.... I think Orlando Bloom is really.... (remembering that she is supposed to be a boy)... a very good actor.
Michelle: He's my favourite too... he's so good looking... He's a bit like you in a way Chris.
Christine: Like me?! How?!
Michelle: Strong... but very sensitive.

(SFX: Telephone ringing)

Serena: Hi Michelle.
Michelle: Hi Serena.
Serena: How did your date go?
Michelle: Fantastic. His name's Chris and I can't stop thinking about him.
Serena: Hey Michelle, good. news. So how did you spend the evening?
Michelle: We went to see The Lord of the Rings and Chris cried... we both did... and after we went to the food hall to have a mango pudding and he told me how he makes mango puddings.
Serena: So Chris cries in movies and gives you the recipe for mango pudding?
Michelle: Yes, isn't it wonderful, a sensitive boy... I didn't think they existed.
Serena: Can I ask you something personal Michelle?
Michelle: Go ahead.
Serena: Did Chris kiss you?
Michelle: It was only our first date.
Serena: So he didn't.
Michelle: No.
Serena: Did you hold hands?
Michelle: No.
Serena: (Pause) Michelle you won't be offended if I say something will you?
Michelle: No Serena, please... go ahead.

Music

(SFX: Knocking on Chris' door with her knuckles)

Christine: Chris... Chris are you awake?
Chris: (The sound of Chris coughing through the door)
Christine: Chris, I've made you some tea... Can I come in?
Chris: (The sound of Chris coughing through the door. In a voice thick with flu)
Come in.

(SFX: Opening door)

Christine: You poor thing. How are you feeling?
Chris: Terrible.
Christine: Here's some water... swallow these aspirins (SFX: Drinking water, swallowing aspirins) Now sip this hot lemon tea.
Chris: (He sounds full of cold) Thanks..... How did you get on with Michelle?
Christine: Fine. I got in quite late... I didn't want to wake you up.
Chris: Did she think you were me?
Christine: Yes, I think she did.
Chris: You gave her a nice time?
Christine: We went to see Lord of the Rings.
Chris: I want to see that. How was it?
Christine: Fantastic.
Chris: Did Michelle like it?
Christine: Very much, and after we went to the food court and had mango pudding.
Chris: Then you came home.
Christine: Not quite, she wanted to go and sit in a swing park... so we went and sat on the swings and looked for stars.
Chris: Did you find any?
Christine: Yes. One.
Chris: Then you came home?
Christine: Up in the same lift, I was very polite, I went up to the twenty second floor with her then back down here.
Chris: What time was that?
Christine: About one.
Chris: And she was happy?
Christine: Oh yes. She took your phone number... and, here... this is her number.
Chris: Thanks.

(SFX: Phone ringing)

Christine: Okay, pick up the phone in here and I'll get the one in the living room. And try not to cough or sneeze.

(SFX: Phone ringing. Stops.)
Hello.
Michelle: The mango pudding was absolutely delicious!
Christine: Good. What was the consistency like?
Michelle: Smooth and creamy.
Christine: Sounds like you did it absolutely right. Did your Mum like it?
Michelle: She loved it... she ate two bowls of it.
Christine: A success then.
Michelle: Yes.
Christine: Like last night.
Michelle: I had a wonderful night, thank you Chris.
Christine: We'll have to do it again.
Michelle: I hope so. (Pause) Chris... you do like me don't you.
Christine: Of course I do.
Michelle: Are you sure?
Christine: Yes. I think you're a really nice girl.
Michelle: Chris.
Christine: Yes.
Michelle: Can I ask you something.
Christine: Of course.
Michelle: Have you ever had a girlfriend before?
Christina: Um... no, not really, not a proper girlfriend.
Michelle: Haven't you?
Christina: I've had girls who are friends, but not a girl friend, if you see what I mean.
Michelle: You do... like girls don't you?
(SFX: Chris can't stop himself coughing and he can be heard on the phone)
What's that? Was that you coughing?
Christina: (SFX: She coughs a bit) Yes, I have got a bit of a cough... maybe it was sitting outside on those swings last night.
Michelle: You poor thing... is your Mother looking after you?
Christina: No, my Mum and Dad are away in China with my Dad.
Michelle: So you're all by yourself?
Christina: No, my sister's looking after me.
Michelle: You didn't tell me you had a sister Chris.
Christine: Didn't I?
Michelle: What's she like?
Christina: She's nice... I think so anyway.
Michelle: Is she like you?
Christina: In some ways.
Michelle: What's her name?
Christina: Christina.
Michelle: Your older sister.
Christina: No... same age as me.
Michelle: The same age?

Christina: We're twins.

Michelle: Oh, how nice, a twin sister. Did you play together when you were little?

Christina: Yes.

Michelle: With her dolls and things?

Christina: Well I suppose I played with her dolls sometimes and she played with my guns and toy soldiers.

Christina: Good idea.

Michelle: So, when can I see you again?

Christina: Um. Next Saturday?

Michelle: That sounds too far away.

Christina: Friday?

Michelle: I don't know if I can wait that long... but, okay... Friday.

Christina: Let's meet at the same place, same time.

Michelle: Can we see another film?

Christina: Sure.

Chris: (Coughing violently) Don't cough into the phone Chris... it's deafening. (laughing) When she asked me if I used to play with my sister's dolls I nearly burst out laughing? And no matter what I am she still likes me. (laughing)

Chris: Don't make fun of her Christine.

Christine: (Trying to stop laughing) Sorry Chris... I tell you what, I nearly had a fit when she said she was coming down.
Chris: I wish I were feeling better.
Christine: You soon will be Chris... another two or three days and you'll be over this cold... and then you'll be able to go on your first date with the lovely Michelle.
